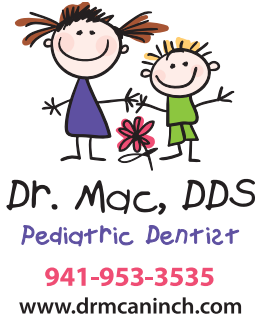

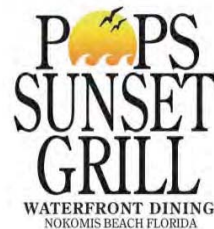

How do I access Pine View's new secure Student Directory?

My School Anywhere is a website used by PVA to provide student contact information to our parents and students and to help communicate to our members about Pine View and reduce the overall amount of paper used.

PVA maintains *MySchoolAnywhere* not only as a directory but as a communication platform (via email) on events, news and any other updates at Pine View.

TO ACCESS DIRECTORY:

You can sign-in at <https://www.myschoolanywhere.com/login.a5w>.

Once you log-in, select “directory search” at the top, and then you may search by family name, student, grade or class.

Please keep in mind that the information provided in this directory is parent/guardian approved. It is possible that not every student at Pine View will be in here.

TO BE ADDED TO THE DIRECTORY:

Go to the *Join PVA* tab at www.yourpva.org

After you create your account, you can add your information. Within 24 hours you will get a confirmation email from My School Anywhere with your secure password. Then you can log-in (see instructions above) and access the directory and you will begin receiving emails about upcoming events at Pine View from PVA.

Why a Legacy Garden?

Pine View's Quad is the heart of our school, the epicenter where all points converge. It is a place for students to gather and socialize, clubs to meet, and outdoor classrooms to learn. It is what unites all 3 schools into one Pine View Campus.

The entire campus has undergone extensive facilities revamping and the Quad needs one too!

As we celebrate our 50th Anniversary we are excited to introduce the concept for **The Legacy Garden**. Pine View's Legacy Garden is a beautification project that will honor our beloved mentors who have bestowed a life-surpassing gift of great impact on this educational institution.

This plan, designed and donated by award-winning landscape architect Michael Gilkey, has considered the culture of our school and our architectural design (by our own PV family: Florida/Caribbean Architect Carl Abbott) It is a collaborative effort with the construction management of Nick Ferguson as this project's lead.

The focal point will be an architecturally sculpted serpentine wall that winds its way through native Florida plantings, flowering trees and a butterfly garden, offering a space for students to sit with one another. 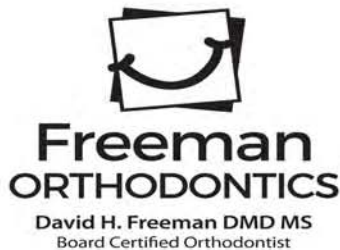

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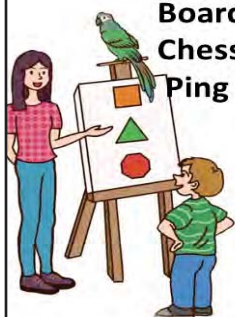

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Principal's Perspective

March/April, 2019

Dear Pine View School Parents and Community:

April is a wonderful time of year, and we have so many exciting activities in all grades! We hope that you are able to celebrate the many achievements of our students during the many awards and culminating events in the coming weeks, and our on-going celebration of Pine View's 50th anniversary. Many of these special and traditional PV events would not be possible without the direct support and critical involvement of our amazing Pine View parents and volunteers- thank you for going the extra degree for our students!

On April 13, Pine View is helping our students, staff, faculty and our community build awareness of healthy choices through the annual Python 5k! At our sixth annual Python Run website, <http://pvpythonrun.com/> you will find information about the Python Run 5K, as well as how you can contribute as a sponsor of the race, race course information, and registration details. See you at the race! Thank you to SmileWorks Dentistry, Dr. M&M, and all our race sponsors for making this great event possible!



On the school website, you will also find information about FSA schedules, Advanced Placement (AP) mock schedules, Advanced Placement (AP) exam schedules, End of Course (EOC) exam schedules and end-of-year activities. We will soon be celebrating "grad bash" in Orlando with our seniors and know that we will have a wonderful time. We had a record number of National Merit Finalists this year, and our students continue to impress me daily!

At several construction Town Hall information meetings, and at the PVA meeting recently, I shared updates regarding the finalization of the current renovation project which is wrapping up, and the beginning phases of our new instructional wing construction project which is still on-track! The first phase is to select an architect and general contractor, and both of these should be completed in the next few months.

Also, at meetings of the Shared Decision-Making Team (SDMT), School Advisory Council (SAC), a PVA meeting, a band and orchestra booster meeting, and two faculty meetings, we shared the on-going work of the Vision-setting Steering Committee at Pine View. Through Forums with Dr. Covert and grade level Guidance Counselors, students are being introduced to the concept of “212” and “going the extra degree”.

Opportunities to compare and contrast examples of going the extra degree in various settings are provided. Grade level recognition of students who have demonstrated that extra degree of effort through moral character or performance character are being showcased on the Pine View “Wall of Fame” proudly displayed in the Student Union. The 212 “Wall of Fame” recognizes students who demonstrate going the extra degree.

Nominations are received from grade level and/or classroom teachers. This recognition may highlight Moral Character (Citizenship, Gratitude, Kindness, Responsibility, Honesty, Respect, Good Sportsmanship) or Performance Character (Personal Improvement, Risk-taking, Diligence, Independent Learning or Enthusiasm). Students may be recognized for a specific action or for demonstrating the 212 “Everyday – Every way” spirit. As Dr. Covert points out when he addresses students, “the true measure of success is not to outdo others but rather to outdo ourselves”. The 212 message certainly reinforces that important notion for Pine View students.

HOMework COMMITTEE UPDATES

Pine View has an unusually engaged and committed community, and we strive to best serve our students, families, and teachers every day in every way. Homework is a topic that impacts all of us, and there are many strong opinions falling on all different sides of the equation. This year we re-convened the homework committee to take a close look at the impact of homework on our various stakeholder groups.

Timeline:

December –

- ◇ Family homework survey shared via Remind.com and Pine Views. Over 500 family members completed the survey.
- ◇ Faculty homework survey completed by 50% of faculty members.

January –

- ◇ Homework survey data shared with faculty at January faculty meeting.
- ◇ Faculty met with families as a Homework Committee on 1/22/19 to discuss students' current experiences with homework. Concerns were shared and student survey was created.

February –

- ◇ Homework committee recommendations were shared at February faculty meeting:
 - ◆ Using internal tracking calendar to coordinate tests and quizzes, as well as long-term assignments to avoid overloading students.
 - ◆ We are aiming for a maximum of 10 minutes of homework per elementary grade level, with a maximum of 90 minutes per night in middle school and 150 minutes per night in high school.
 - ◆ Teachers can help students by giving them a target amount of time that the assignment should take.
 - ◆ Teachers can also help by letting students know of a time limit for an assignment.
- ◇ Student homework survey was shared in 3rd period classes. Over 1000 students completed the survey.
- ◇ Homework Committee re-convened by level to review student survey results on 2/27/19.

HOMework COMMITTEE TAKE-AWAYS:

High School –

- ◇ In 9th and 10th grade, students report the majority of homework coming from math and science, but by 11th and 12th the subjects are more diverse due to different student electives and interests.
- ◇ It is essential for students to use the planning tools from guidance department to anticipate the amount of homework that AP classes will entail.
- ◇ By 11th and 12th grade students also report a bit more balance in the amount of homework, and may have developed more strategies to complete homework in an efficient manner.

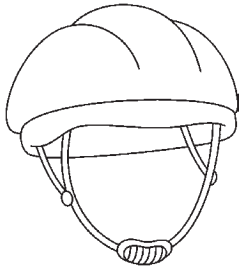
Middle School –

- ◇ Students in grades 6-8 should average 90 minutes of homework per night at a maximum. Ms. Fair and the middle school teachers are working together to assess actual time needed to complete assigned tasks.
- ◇ Parents have expressed that the homework load in middle school is becoming more manageable and we are celebrating this trend.
- ◇ Students should take advantage of designated time in class to get as much of their work done during school hours as possible, to limit amount of work that needs to be brought home.

Elementary School –

- ◇ We noticed on the student survey that the vast majority of the students felt their homework was in the desired range of about 10 minutes per grade level.
- ◇ Elementary teachers are interested in student feedback if an assignment takes far longer than expected.
- ◇ Elementary teams will work on creating guidelines for parents as to how to help at home. We will also look into sharing cut-off times to make sure students aren't taking an overly perfectionist approach to an assignment that was supposed to be quick.

It has been very exciting to work with so many engaged and committed individuals, and we can see the reason we are the #1 School in Florida. Thank you for your help in identifying ways to continue to improve and to give our Pine View students the best possible experience.

Community Involvement – Volunteers Count!

Level 1 Volunteering

Level 1 is the starting point for all volunteering. You must be Level 1 approved before you can be Level 2 approved. With a Level 1 clearance, you must stay within eye and earshot of a school faculty member or teacher at all times.

To become a Level 1 volunteer, you should:

1. **Sign up!** Sign up on the district's volunteer portal called [Volunteers Count!](#) You can do this from home, at any Sarasota County school, or at the Office of Community Involvement (OCI) the Landings. OCI will notify you when you are approved.
2. **Reach out!** Once approved, you will be added to the schools approved volunteer list. If you are eager, reach out to schools so you can get started ASAP!
3. **Find the best fit!** If you aren't sure where you want to volunteer or what you want to do, contact the school district's Office of Community Involvement to find a school that needs your specific skill set. You can call (941) 927-9000 ext. 31500 or e-mail CommunityInvolvement@sarasotacountyschools.net.
4. **Possibly get Level 2!** Once you are level one approved, you may proceed to get your Level 2 clearance completed. Please Click "Level 2 Volunteering" to learn more.

Level 2 Volunteering

Level 2 is the highest volunteer clearance. This clearance permits you to be alone with students for volunteering purposes. This is also a common clearance needed to chaperone field trips and mentor. To get a Level 2 clearance, you must be fingerprinted by the district's Safety and Security Department.

To become a Level 2 volunteer, you should...

1. **Get Level 1!** You must first be a Level 1 volunteer before you become a Level 2 volunteer. You can become a Level 1 volunteer by applying on our volunteer portal, [Volunteers Count!](#)
2. **Be fingerprinted!** You can be fingerprinted at the District Safety and Security Department at the Landings or the North Port Police Department. The Office of Community Involvement will notify you once you are approved.

How Does Exercise Impact Learning?

Everyone knows exercise is good for your body. However, did you know that exercise immediately benefits your brain as well?

Exercise produces numerous chemicals that affect cognition, mood, and executive function. A chemical that dramatically increases post-exercise is BDNF.

BDNF – Brain-Derived Neurotrophic Factor – is like “miracle grow” for your brain.

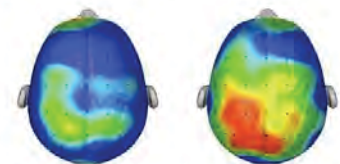
BDNF causes growth in connections of brain cells (learning), growth of capacity of systems (attention, memory), and is even involved in growing new brain cells (previously not thought possible!).

BDNF is an anti-depressant, anti-toxic stress factor and correlates with intelligence and memory. Dr. John Ratey, a psychiatrist from Harvard, says that if exercise was a medication, we would all want to buy it – the effects are so beneficial and so powerful.

Exercise is directly linked to the production of BDNF, and some doctors (including Dr. Ratey) are using it as a “new prescription” to treat depression, ADHD, autism, and more.

“SPARK Brain Builders” is an expansion of the already successful Run Club – SPARK will be held five days a week, starting towards the end of September. Flyers will be coming home soon for elementary and middle school!!!
