Renewing the voter-approved millage will not increase taxes.

Sarasota County is one of only two of the state's 67 school districts to be graded A by the Florida Department of Education every year since grading began in 2004.

The district weathered the economic downturn without falling below the School Board's policy of maintaining a reserve fund of 7.5 percent of appropriations.

The funds stay in Sarasota County to help local schools. The 1 mill will yield about \$56 million in Fiscal Year 2018, roughly 13 percent of the district's operating budget.

#### Voters must register by Feb. 20 to be eligible to vote March 20.



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
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February, 2018 Dear Pine View School Parents and Community:

#### (Useful Information – Please Keep!)

#### You can review your student's attendance information on the 'Parent/Student Portal' [Click "Attendance", then, "Show details", 2<sup>nd</sup> column indicates the 'Official Record']

ALL absences (including those for religious observance) must have one of the following to be considered EXCUSED:

- 1. <u>AN ABSENT NOTE</u> signed by a parent/guardian and turned into the front office within 3 days of a student's return to school. The note must include your child's first and last name, their grade, the reason for the absence and a parent/guardian *signature*.
- 2. <u>A DOCTOR NOTE</u> can be dropped off to the front office or faxed directly to 941-486-2042.
- 3. <u>A PASSPORT</u>. Three days prior to a known *full day* absence, your student should bring a note signed by a parent/guardian to the front office requesting a passport. The passport is then signed by all teachers and a parent/guardian before being returned to the front office for administrative review.

#### TARDY: LATE TO SCHOOL

When your child is late to school from home they must have a note *signed* by a parent/guardian, or a doctor note in order for the tardy or missed class(s) to be considered excused. A tardy note must be brought to the front office the day of the tardy or within two days following the late arrival to school.

#### EARLY DISMISSALS

ABSENCES

All students leaving campus early MUST be signed out in the front office. A student leaving early should bring a signed note from a parent/guardian to the front office before school or during lunch so that they may obtain a pass to be dismissed from class. High school students (*including those who are 18*) that are leaving campus early and driving themselves MUST have a signed note from a parent or guardian advising that the student has permission to leave school early. If a student is being picked up by someone *other* than a parent/guardian, they MUST have a signed note from the parent/guardian giving permission for the student to leave with the person named in the note and this individual must be on the student's contact list.

#### EXCESSIVE EXCUSED ABSENCES

If a student has **9** EXCUSED absences/semester or **18** EXCUSED absences/year which have not been excused with a doctor note or passport, the Sarasota County School District deems this to be excessive and Pine View School will require doctor notes *for the remainder of the school year* in order for future absences to be considered excused. If your child has a doctor visit during an absence, it is always *strongly* recommended that a doctor note is used in lieu of a signed note from home.

#### EXCESSIVE EXCUSED TARDIES (LATE TO SCHOOL)

If a student has **9** excused tardies/semester or **18** excused tardies/year (*including* those excused with a doctor note) Pine View School considers this excessive and will require doctor notes for the remainder of the year in order for all future tardies to be considered excused.

#### UNEXCUSED TARDIES - LATE TO SCHOOL

If a student  $(10^{th} - 12^{th} \text{ grade})$  is late to school five times without a note from a parent/guardian or a doctor's office, a letter will be mailed home inviting that student to join the "Morning Wake-Up Club". If the family 'opts in' to this attendance intervention they will receive an automated Connect-Ed message at 6:30am encouraging their student to arrive on time for school.

#### **UNEXCUSED ABSENCES**

When a student (grades 6 - 12) has 5 unexcused absences (full day or single period) they will be referred to their respective assistant principal. <u>Additionally</u>: The Department of Motor Vehicles will be notified by the school district when a student (applies to students who **are** or **will be 14** years of age during the school year, but have not yet reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday) has reached 15 unexcused absences within a running 90-day period. This list is generated weekly at the district level. At that time the student's driver's license or driver's permit may be revoked.







# Our club is called Spark Brain Builders

A before school exercise program to prime the brain for learning

#### How Does Exercise Impact Learning?

Everyone knows exercise is good for your body. However, did you know that exercise immediately benefits your brain as well?

Exercise produces numerous chemicals that affect cognition, mood, and executive function. A chemical that dramatically increases post-exercise is BDNF.

BDNF – Brain-Derived Neurotrophic Factor – is like "miracle grow" for your brain.

BDNF causes growth in connections of brain cells (learning), growth of capacity of systems (attention, memory), and is even involved in growing new brain cells (previously not thought possible!).

BDNF is an anti-depressant, anti-toxic stress factor and correlates with intelligence and memory. Dr. John Ratey, a psychiatrist from Harvard, says that if exercise was a medication, we would all want to buy it – the effects are so beneficial and so powerful.

Exercise is directly linked to the production of BDNF, and some doctors (including Dr. Ratey) are using it as a "new prescription" to treat depression, ADHD, autism, and more.

We know there are lots of wonderful moments at our school, but we also know that there can also be uncomfortable or challenging times, and we are committed to helping our students through their social and emotional challenges as well as their academics.

In the month of January, all of our students, from second through twelfth grades, had an opportunity to learn about bullying and to sign a pledge, committing not to be a bully and to stand up and say something if they see bullying behavior. We know a one-time discussion and pledge are only going to take us so far, and we hope this will be an ongoing conversation across our community. To that aim, we wanted to include our students' families in learning about bullying. Take the following

quiz with your child to see what they can teach you!

- 1. (TRUE / FALSE) If someone hurts you or is mean to you, it is bullying, even if it is by accident.
- 2. (TRUE / FALSE) Sticks and stones can break your bones, but words can never hurt you.
- 3. (TRUE / FALSE) Bystanders have power to help stop bullying.
- 4. (TRUE / FALSE) Once a bully, always a bully.

Answer key:

- 1. FALSE Bullying is defined as purposefully and repeatedly hurting one or more students. Sometimes people can be make mistakes and sometimes people can be mean. We can address these scenarios, of course, but in order to define something as bullying, we are looking at repeated and purposeful hurt that the victim is not able to escape.
- 2. FALSE Words can be extremely hurtful. Harassing or humiliating someone is not tolerated at Pine View whether the verbal attacks happen at school or happen online using technology, they still are not acceptable.
- 3. TRUE One of the key components of our anti-bullying program is to teach students that bystanders have choices. With their behavior, they can demonstrate that they do not appreciate or approve of bullying behaviors. Some bystanders feel comfortable approaching a bully and asking them to stop. Others are willing to stand beside a target and keep them company. Others may want to go tell a trusted adult. There are many ways to show support for a person who is experiencing bullying, and these ways have the power to shut down bullying.
- 4. FALSE Think of bully as a verb, not a noun. A person who is bullying someone else has the power to make a choice to act differently. The rest of us can help!

We are very proud of our students and we hope to continue to empower them to make a positive difference.
