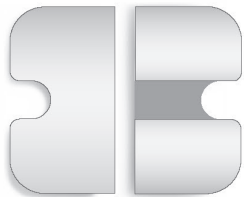

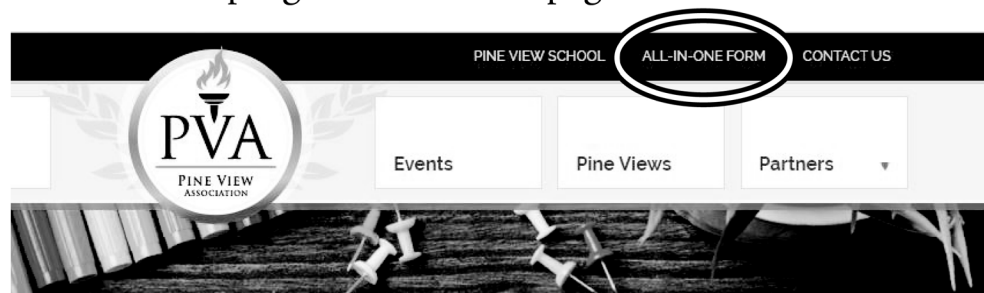

What an amazing start to our fall weather in Sarasota, Florida! Pine View School wants to express how grateful we are for the incredible turnout at the Pine View Fair in October! This event, sponsored by PVA and chaired by the Gavette's, would not have been such a huge success without countless parent and teacher volunteers. Our PVA, and President Ben Turoff and the executive board, are truly passionate and enthusiastic supporters of our students, our teachers, and our school- they always go the extra degree! In addition to a fun and enjoyable Saturday at Pine View, all of the proceeds directly go to support the activities our children experience everyday on campus. I believe everyone had a wonderful time- especially those who dunked me in the tank! ☺ Again, thank you for your support!



The campus renovation project is on-track and we have been enjoying our wonderful new Auditorium and Student Union! New seating, lights, and flooring have all been great additions along with sound, and infrastructure. The Orange Building is being completed and will be re-occupied at the start of the second semester. The planning for the fencing project began more than five years ago, prior to my arrival at Pine View, and is almost complete! This single-point-of-entry project will help ensure all visitors check-in as they arrive on campus. Students will be able to come onto campus, per usual in the mornings, and after 9:30am, will need to report through the Main Office for a tardy pass. Movement on the interior of campus will not be altered in any way, and the project only helps to improve our safety and security of students.

The first PVA-sponsored Town Hall meeting, on October 26, focused on school-parent communication and engagement. We appreciate everyone who came out, and the question and answer portion was very beneficial. The next Town Hall session will focus on Curriculum at Pine View, with information on Dual Enrollment and Advanced Placement courses, as well as curriculum from grades 2 through 8 to prepare students for success. Pine View is so much more than scores and rankings, and information about our commitment as a community to fine and performing arts will also be shared! Everyone is welcome on November 16th at 6pm in the Multipurpose Room.

Our School Improvement Plan (SIP) was recently reviewed through faculty input, parent and student input through the School Advisory Council (SAC), and has been submitted for approval. The SIP is aligned with our school mission, and based on measurable data. Pine View enjoys such a strong tradition of excellence, and our students' successes are predicated on a rigorous environment where academic challenge is closely tied to the expectation that students are committed to social responsibility.

ABSENCES

ALL absences (*including those for religious observance*) must have one of the following to be considered EXCUSED:

1. **AN ABSENT NOTE** signed by a parent/guardian and turned into the front office **within 3 days of a student's return to school**. The note must include your child's first and last name, their grade, the reason for the absence and a parent/guardian *signature*.
2. **A DOCTOR NOTE** can be dropped off to the front office or faxed directly to 941-486-2042.
3. **A PASSPORT**. Three days prior to a known *full day* absence, your student should bring a note signed by a parent/guardian to the front office requesting a passport. The passport is then signed by all teachers and a parent/guardian before being returned to the front office for administrative review.

TARDY: LATE TO SCHOOL

When your child is late to school from home they must have a note *signed* by a parent/guardian, or a doctor note in order for the tardy or missed class(s) to be considered excused. A tardy note must be brought to the front office the day of the tardy or within two days following the late arrival to school.

EARLY DISMISSALS

All students leaving campus early **MUST** be signed out in the front office. A student leaving early should bring a signed note from a parent/guardian to the front office before school or during lunch so that they may obtain a pass to be dismissed from class. High school students (*including those who are 18*) that are leaving campus early and driving themselves **MUST** have a signed note from a parent or guardian advising that the student has permission to leave school early. If a student is being picked up by someone *other* than a parent/guardian, they **MUST** have a signed note from the parent/guardian giving permission for the student to leave with the person named in the note and this individual must be on the student's contact list.

EXCESSIVE EXCUSED ABSENCES

If a student has **9 EXCUSED** absences/semester or **18 EXCUSED** absences/year which have not been excused with a doctor note or passport, the Sarasota County School District deems this to be excessive and Pine View School will require doctor notes *for the remainder of the school year* in order for future absences to be considered excused. If your child has a doctor visit during an absence, it is always *strongly* recommended that a doctor note is used in lieu of a signed note from home.

EXCESSIVE EXCUSED TARDIES (LATE TO SCHOOL)

If a student has **9 excused** tardies/semester or **18 excused** tardies/year (*including* those excused with a doctor note) Pine View School considers this excessive and will require doctor notes for the remainder of the year in order for all future tardies to be considered excused.

UNEXCUSED TARDIES – LATE TO SCHOOL

If a student (10th – 12th grade) is late to school five times without a note from a parent/guardian or a doctor's office, a letter will be mailed home inviting that student to join the "Morning Wake-Up Club". If the family 'opts in' to this attendance intervention they will receive an automated Connect-Ed message at 6:30am encouraging their student to arrive on time for school.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

When a student (grades 6 – 12) has 5 unexcused absences (full day or single period) they will be referred to their respective assistant principal. **Additionally:** The Department of Motor Vehicles will be notified by the school district when a student (applies to students who **are** or **will be 14** years of age during the school year, but have not yet reached their 18th birthday) has reached 15 unexcused absences within a running 90-day period. This list is generated weekly at the district level. At that time the student's driver's license or driver's permit may be revoked.

How Does Exercise Impact Learning?

Everyone knows exercise is good for your body. However, did you know that exercise immediately benefits your brain as well?

Exercise produces numerous chemicals that affect cognition, mood, and executive function. A chemical that dramatically increases post-exercise is BDNF.

BDNF – Brain-Derived Neurotrophic Factor – is like “miracle grow” for your brain.

BDNF causes growth in connections of brain cells (learning), growth of capacity of systems (attention, memory), and is even involved in growing new brain cells (previously not thought possible!).

BDNF is an anti-depressant, anti-toxic stress factor and correlates with intelligence and memory. Dr. John Ratey, a psychiatrist from Harvard, says that if exercise was a medication, we would all want to buy it – the effects are so beneficial and so powerful.

Exercise is directly linked to the production of BDNF, and some doctors (including Dr. Ratey) are using it as a “new prescription” to treat depression, ADHD, autism, and more.

“SPARK Brain Builders” is an expansion of the already successful Run Club – SPARK will be held five days a week, starting towards the end of September. Flyers will be coming home soon for elementary and middle school!!

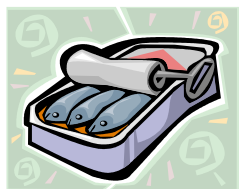

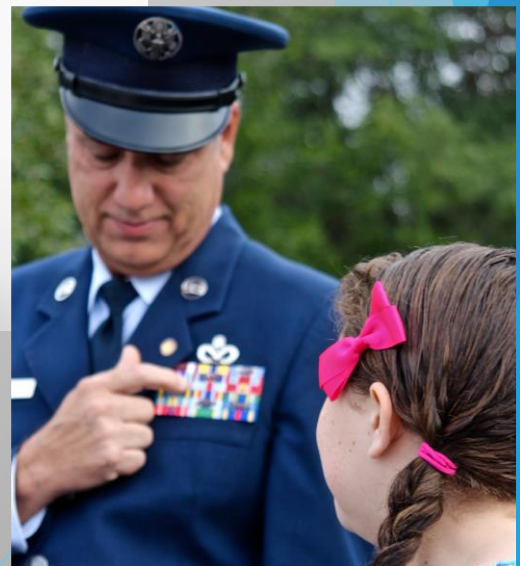

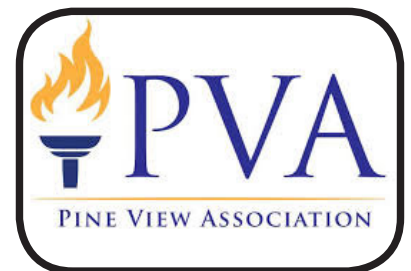
