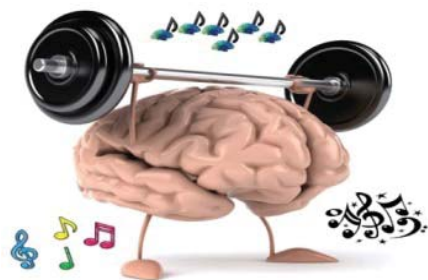


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Principal's Perspective

LOCKERS

Please carefully read the locker assignments. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Lockers for students in grades 6-12 will be rented on the following dates:

Saturday, August 12 8:00 a.m - 12:00 p.m.

The following locker assignments will be available for specific grades:

Lockers will be rented outside each pod for \$1.07. If you do not have a **school approved lock** from last year, the cost to purchase a new lock will be \$5.35. You will keep this lock the entire time you are a Pine View student. Bringing the exact change would be appreciated.

You **will not** be allowed to rent a locker if you do not have a **Pine View combination lock** to hang on the locker you select. You must know your combination. Only one locker per student. You **must** have a lock that day to reserve a locker!!

The procedure to rent a locker will be as follows:

1. There will be a removable tag on the door of each locker.
2. Choose the locker you wish to use (you must abide by the above locker assignments. If you do not, your lock will be removed.)
3. Hang your lock on the locker of your choice.
4. Write your name, grade, locker number, and combination on the tag, then peel it off the door and take it to the volunteer sitting outside your locker pod. She will give you an index card to write the same information for you to take home.
5. You may not buy a locker for anyone else unless you have all the above information and also have their lock to hang on the locker.

If you need to purchase a new lock, go to one of the stations outside each locker pod to purchase one and then follow the above steps.

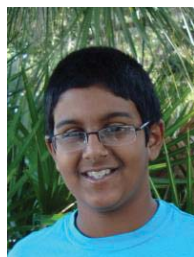

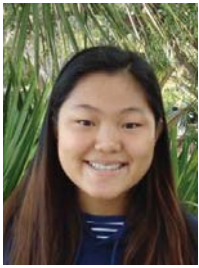

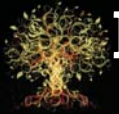
