



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Look What's Happening in Our Classrooms:

Grandusky - My classes have been working really hard on some great reading and writing activities. In 8th grade we've been working on *To Kill a Mockingbird*. Thanks to the SET team here on campus, we're going to be relating the book to some non-fiction articles with the theme of "walk in another's shoes".

In 6th we've all read the young adult version of *Pay it Forward* and will be discussing the impact of this novel in the GBC (Grandusky Book Club). Mrs. Sandburg from guidance will help lead a discussion about the power of acts of kindness. Feb 17th is RAK (Random Acts of Kindness Day), so our circles will encourage kids to participate in that! Our classes are reading Raymie Nightingale by Kate DiCamillo in class and are focusing on the motifs of friendship and good deeds. It's a lovely book, and the kids are really enjoying it thus far!

I'm also challenging both grade levels to a kindness campaign. We'll all identify nice things that students have done and/or have been done for them. We'll celebrate these things on Feb 14th in kindness circles and talk about the value of paying our kindness forward. We'll also log these acts on abillionacts.org (which is a sight encouraging people to get out there and do some good!)

We, of course, focus on academics here at PV, but without educating their hearts, we might be missing the point!

Schran - Florida Studio Theatre came in the 6th grade Language Arts rooms last month and gave a workshop to our students on playwriting.

We are also reading a new novel, *Raymie Nightingale*. The focus is on identifying literary elements, figurative language, themes, motifs, symbols, and tone changes.

The 6th grade also went on a field trip to Mote a couple weeks ago and we had a great time learning about the marine life in Florida.

Schroeter's - 6th graders, The new group for 2nd semester is flourishing producing artwork inspired by Edvard Munch's "The Scream" and Discussing Renaissance Linear Perspective.

Schroeter's - 7th graders are deciding the differences between Graffiti and Street Art, while producing a 3D paper-mache original figure in the style of Keith Haring. They have included the same message of love and acceptance seen in Haring's subway pieces from the '80s. I am soooo proud of their ideas!

Braun - 7th grade civics is finishing up Animal Farm. The students are loving it. We began by reviewing the Russian Revolution. We finish up with a project and a comparison with the North Korean government today.

Schell - the kids are writing and writing and mentoring while writing! On the back of this page you will see both the 4^{th} grade and the 7^{th} grade Essay Checklists. The students are to read each other's writings and check off the included components. This will require them to talk with each other for identification purposes. Very powerful!

On Saturday, February 25th Mrs. Schell and students will be at Barnes & Noble to support our 1st Amendment Freedom of Speech. We will be presenting Banned Books and the research behind their shunning, so to speak.

Fourth-grade teachers Jennifer Wise and Eduardo Maron love to teach and make a difference in their students' lives. The Blue team teachers hope to inspire their students to be lifelong learners. As a team, Wise and Maron believe that collaboration and group activities are what strengthens their students.

Both Wise and Maron claim that even after years of teaching that there is never a dull moment. "I like teaching because every day is different from the next, and I like the fact that when you wake up in the morning, and you really don't know what the day is going to look like, and that's really exciting to me," Maron

"All of us are extremely respectful, unselfish, and flexible which makes us such a great team," Delaney said.





Dear Pine View Parents,

We are en route to a fantastic second half of the school year. You may have heard that many students participate in the Pine View Orchestra program. In fact, we have over 180 students currently involved in our award-winning program. The students work diligently toward their goals, perform beautiful concerts and earn recognition from various music adjudicators throughout the state. The Pine View Orchestra program consistently earns Superior ratings at Concert Festivals, and Orchestra students consistently earn ratings of Superior and Superior with Distinction at Solo & Ensemble Festivals.

While these accolades are certainly noteworthy, the most critical successes that the students attain are these: confidence, determination, a sense of artistry, and a strong desire to be part of a friendly and talented group of students. At Pine View, we guide our students toward their goals, awaken their interests, and celebrate their efforts to make the world a better place. Many students excel at their instrument and use it as part of their college application process.

Playing an orchestral instrument - violin, viola, cello, bass - is akin to opening up a great book; the melodies, rhythms and historical context take you to another place and time in an emotionally moving, experiential way. And for President's Day we had a Missing Presidents Contest.



Update from the Backpack Commitee

Thanks to all the families and teachers who have helped us learn what we can do to help our students *lessen the load*. Recent successes include:

- Provision of lockers for 6th graders All 6th graders are now eligible for a locker. All they need is a locker buddy and a \$5 Pine View lock (which they can keep for the rest of their PV career). Thanks to Ms. Fair for facilitating this responsive step.
- Coordination with PV faculty at February's faculty meeting – We shared some suggestions and learned about what faculty members are already doing to help. We plan to collaborate as a faculty to make sure the agenda is as streamlined as possible for next year – every ounce counts!

Important note: More and more we see that the students are the critical piece in this equation. Some teachers advise students to take apart their workbooks (so they only have to carry a chapter at a time), or to only bring a certain book once a week, but our students don't always follow through. Encourage your children to problem-solve the issues they face – there may be a solution at their fingertips.





The Pine View Elementary Difference

Gifted students have several options in Sarasota County. What makes Pine View so unique?

Academics

- Pine View teachers have taken 300 hours of coursework to help them meet the needs of gifted learners. They work to address our students' creativity, sensitivity, and craving for intellectual stimulation.
- o Pine View teachers plan instruction that pushes students beyond easy answers and into conceptual understanding. Some students comment that "enrichment" at their previous schools was just "more of the same." At Pine View, we offer a *qualitatively different* academic experience that helps students take ownership of their learning.
- Our students don't just coast through they learn the value of effort. Regardless of where each student starts, our teachers push each one to grow in a variety of challenging areas including literary analysis, math reasoning, persuasive writing, scientific inquiry, public speaking, media literacy, athleticism, sportsmanship, and musical and artistic expression.



- Our faculty applies best practices we learn from current research to help our students perform at their best. We know physical movement drives brain growth and we incorporate an extra recess opportunity in 2nd and 3rd grades, in addition to a before- school running club that any elementary or middle school student can join for free.
- We have green thumbs! If you haven't seen our school garden, you will be amazed at the bounty we consistently harvest. Additionally, many of our elementary classrooms have "tower gardens" where students can snack on greens and veggies as they wish.
- We know many of our students are prone to perfectionism and may struggle with accepting mistakes. We offer opportunities before and during school for students to learn mindfulness techniques to help them *respond* rather than *react* to challenges.

Social-Emotional Learning

- O In many elementary schools there is only one gifted class per grade. Students at Pine View have multiple classes per grade, and this larger cohort of gifted peers allows for students to find others to really connect with.
- Students notice the increased independence and responsibility immediately upon entering elementary school – they suddenly have choices about where to eat lunch, and they begin walking themselves to class in third grade. Our teachers work to foster life skills such as organization, resilience, and self-advocacy by giving students progressively more responsibility for their education.
- o Our faculty is committed to helping our students cope with and learn from difficult situations. We use restorative circles to give students a voice in solving real life problems, and we operate from a growth mindset which teaches that mistakes are not identity threats, but are instead learning opportunities (or "discoveries").



Shared Decision Making Team

Minutes from January 26th Meeting

The last few weeks have been a busy and exciting time for Pine View students with field trips to Washington D.C., Dakin Farms, All State Choir, and Biz Town to name a few! The SDMT by-laws which were re-adopted last spring after review and were covered in previous meeting minutes of SDMT contain three standing subcommittees: *Personnel, budget, and curriculum*. The purpose of the three standing subcommittees is to focus the energy and thought of SDMT on those three main areas relative to the school improvement plan and our mission as a school.

- The *personnel subcommittee* would give thought and consideration to recommending interview questions to get the highest quality candidates to work with gifted students.
- The budget subcommittee would review the district allocated dollars and school budget and make recommendations on school instructional priorities to help our students.
- The *curriculum subcommittee* would look at courses offered at Pine View and make recommendations to SDMT for suggested additions, deletions, or changes to maximize our mission with students.

The payroll office informed us that School Recognition or A+ funds are to be included in the February 15th paycheck and the total amount is \$214,107 which is divided among the employees in 15-16. The 2017-2018 high school course catalogue is now posted on the PV website- on the right-hand side, under Academics. Several new offerings are listed, as well as the return of ENC 1101/1102 (on page 58). Department Chairs and faculty are involved annually in recommending courses for addition or deletion. Our counselors have been meeting with all rising 9th through 12th grade students and sharing the high school course description book which contains some noteworthy improvements: a time budget worksheet for students and parents, PSAT / AP score comparison charts, and flow charts which provide a visual representation for pathways.

Possible solutions about high volume of copy use (Blding. 16 and Media Center) now that front office copiers cannot be used were discussed; use of District Print Shop, Mrs. Nzeza suggested an "Inbox" – teacher name, number of copies then volunteers can make copies and teachers can pick them up in front office. Lastly, a quick note for the electricians to look into the bathroom light issue in Blding 16.
