Your PVA at Work

PVA's mission is to support Pine View and its students. We couldn't do so without the support of the PV community. So . . . in this season of thankfulness, we thank YOU for supporting PVA – with your time, your treasure, and your incredible talent. It is our pleasure to share with you some of the ways in which your support has already made a difference this school year in the PV community. We know that it seems like PVA is always fundraising – always asking for more. But we do so in order to be able to GIVE more to our school and our kids – that's the fun part - and we'd like to share the fun with you!

Pine View School Budget Shortfall: Every year, there is a gap between what it costs to keep PV running at full steam (by going 212 – see what we did there?), and what the state and district provide. And it's a big gap! Through your support, PVA is able to help fill it. At the beginning of this school year, PVA wrote a check to Pine View School in the amount of **\$48,108**.

New Parent and Student Coffees and Programs: By providing refreshments, materials and volunteers, PVA sponsored more than 10 events to welcome new families to our school.

Welcome Back Luncheon for Faculty & Staff: On August 5, 2019, PVA was pleased to organize and sponsor a welcome-back luncheon for our amazing faculty & staff.

Agendas: Every student at Pine View is provided an agenda to keep track of all the ways in which they work, achieve and shine. PVA is proud to continue our long-standing tradition of paying for each and every one.

P.A.C.E.: Provides much needed funds for classroom items thanks to donations from Pine View families. This year \$39,094.00 was raised!

Funding Requests: Throughout the year, various parts of the PV community come to PVA for financial assistance. Here is a summary of the funding requests we have approved so far this school year:

Middle School Robotics Club: PVA funds will be used toward the purchase ten Lego Mindstorm Core sets, so that our middle school robotics kids have access to the newest equipment and software. **\$2059.75**

Pine View History Club: PVA funds will be used to help make the History Club's school-wide history simulation engaging and realistic. **\$570.00**

Pine View Band: Over the past three years, PVA has provided PV's amazing band with financial support of approximately \$15,000. We are thrilled to be able to continue our annual support of the Band, and recently approved a funding request in the amount of **\$5,000**.

We have several pending funding requests for the PVA Board to consider. We will keep you updated on the amazing things happening at Pine View due to **your** support of PVA.

Attention Pine View School Parents

We are excited to announce that we will be using Membership Toolkit for our Directory, Online Sales and Communications starting with the 2019-2020 school year.

We invite you to visit yourpva.membershiptoolkit.com to see everything your Pine View Association has to offer this year. Once you create a verified Membership Toolkit Account, you will have access to view our PVA Student Directory.

When registering and creating an account, as long as you use the email address that the invitation has been sent to, your user account will be automatically linked to your information we imported from MySchoolAnywhere.

Here's what you need to do:

- Go to <https://yourpva.membershiptoolkit.com>.
 - Click on the Register/Login button.
 - If you already have an account with another organization that uses Membership Toolkit you can use the same email and password to login. You can then proceed to the numbered steps below.
 - Select "Create Account" and fill in the name, email, and password information.
 - Click "verify my email" and then check your email for a link to complete the process. The link expires in 2 hours. If you do not receive the email, check your spam or junk folders.
 - Once you have verified your email address, log back in and finish the registration process.
1. Complete or confirm the **Parent/Family and Student Information**.
 2. Complete or confirm the **Directory/Publish Preferences**.
 3. Once these forms are completed or confirmed, you will have access to the PVA Student Directory!

Once the Primary Account is set up, the **Primary User can "invite" other email addresses** to access his/her account. This allows the Secondary User to have their own login information, but still have access to the family account.

ATTENDANCE POLICIES

You can view your student's attendance information on the 'FAMILY ACCESS' portal

ALL ABSENCES For an absence (including those for religious observance) to be considered **excused**, one of the following must be submitted to the front office within 3 days of a student's return to school:

- **Signed absent note from parent/guardian** that includes student name/grade/dates of absence/reason for absence. If a reason is not given the absence will not be excused.
- **Doctor Note** – Highly recommended anytime available.
- **Passports** - To excuse a future, full day absence, a student must bring a signed note to the front office at least 3 days prior to the anticipated absence. This note is then attached to the passport form which must be signed by all teachers and a parent/guardian before being returned to the front office for administrative review. Passports will NOT be excused for students identified as *excessively absent* (see below) or during FSA's, EOC's or other standardized testing.

PARTIAL DAY ATTENDANCE

Per Sarasota County School Board policy, a middle or high school student must be present 4 periods of the school day to be considered in attendance for the day. Elementary students must be in attendance until 12:30 and/or not dismissed prior to 12:30 to be considered in attendance for the day.

EARLY DISMISSAL PROCEDURE

All students leaving campus prior to the end of their academic day **MUST** be signed out in the front office. To avoid classroom disruptions, a student should bring a signed note from a parent/guardian to the front office before school to obtain a pass to be dismissed from class. The student then meets their parent/guardian in the front office for sign-out. High school students (including those who are 18) leaving campus early and driving themselves **MUST** have a signed note from a parent or guardian advising that the student has permission to leave school early (For safety, random verification calls to home will be made). If a student is being picked up by someone other than a parent/guardian, the student **MUST** have a signed note from the registering parent/guardian giving permission for the student to leave with the person named in the note.

EXCESSIVE EXCUSED LATE ARRIVALS/EARLY DISMISSALS

If a student has 5 excused late arrivals or early dismissals in a semester, Pine View School considers this excessive and will require doctor notes for future late arrivals/early dismissals to be considered excused.

EXCESSIVE ABSENCES

If a student has nine absences/semester or eighteen absences/year which have not been excused with medical documentation, the Sarasota County School District deems this to be excessive and Pine View School will require doctor notes for future absences to be considered excused.

MORNING WAKE-UP CLUB

If a high school student is late to school five times without an excuse note, the student will receive a letter inviting them to join the "Morning Wake-Up Club". If the family 'opts in' to this intervention they will receive an automated Connect-Ed message at 6:30am encouraging their student to arrive on time for school.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

High School students: Attendance and administration closely monitor unexcused absences (full day or any day with one or more unexcused class periods) and the following steps are taken:

5 unexcused – counseled by grade level administrator

10 unexcused – Saturday school and referral

15 unexcused – Saturday school and **** Loss of PV parking for two weeks (HS only)****

LOSS OF PERMIT/DRIVER'S LICENSE (8th-12th Grade)

The attendance records of students (ages 14 - 17, 8th - 12th grade) who have 15 unexcused absences (includes any day with one or more unexcused class periods) within a 90-calendar day period are automatically forwarded to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicle by the Sarasota County School District and driving privileges (license/permit) may be revoked.

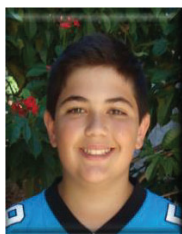

News from Carline – Policies and Associated Rationales

Hello Pine View Families!

Your carline attendants want to help make your experience as pleasant as possible, and we know that drop-off and pickup can be stressful times of the day. Here are some tips to try to make things easier:

High School Morning Drop-off in the Parent Loop

- Students should not be exiting the left side of the vehicle at any time for any reason. We realize many of our students are learning to drive but students are left vulnerable if they are out of the car on the left to switch seats with a parent.
- When cars are unloading their students, passing them is a safety hazard. Please stay in the right lane to drop off your student and then merge into the left lane to exit the parent loop.
- Pull up as far as possible in the drop off lane to keep traffic flowing.

Elementary and Middle School Morning Drop-off in the Parent Loop

- Around 200 cars drop off students in the loop between 8:45 and 9:15!
- Did you know that we can fit almost 20 cars in the parent loop at a time? Please pull your car all the way up so that as many students as possible can exit their vehicles at one time. There may be 100 cars behind you!
- Once you have reached the sidewalk/awnings, and the cars in front of you have stopped, students should exit their vehicle. *Using the whole sidewalk for drop-off helps carline move more quickly.*
- Students must exit their vehicle on the **curb side only** for safety reasons.
- The lanes merge at the end of the loop – students must be dropped off at the curb prior to the merge.
- We really appreciate your children having their things organized so they can quickly hop out. If your child requires a great deal of assistance, you should use the parking lot or pull forward to the end of the loop.
- Parent expectations – please put your phone away, wait in the line unless otherwise directed – don't pull around a car that has stopped, stay in your vehicle, drive cautiously (5 mph), and bear with us as we try to get all of the cars and students where they need to go.
- Efficient drop-offs help all of our students arrive at class on time!

Morning Drop-off requiring assistance

- If you need to get out of your vehicle or accompany your child onto campus, please park in the visitors' spots in the main parking lot.
- Make sure to sign in at the office if you are walking your child to class. Our school day starts at 7:21 for high school students, so all visitors need to be signed in between 7:21 and 3:52.

Afternoon Pick-up in the Parent Loop

- We have around 100 cars picking up students in the loop between 3:50 and 4:15.
- It is essential that you pull your car all the way up, regardless of where your child is standing. You may want to remind your child to watch for you, and feel free to ask one of the attendants to call for your child if s/he didn't see you.
- Please only allow your child to enter the car on the curb side. Traffic is moving through the outside lane, and our students' safety is our priority.
- Elementary students who are not picked up by 4:10 may be asked to wait in the office. If your children are in the office after carline is over, you may park in the loop and come in and get them.
- High school pickup – please do not switch drivers in the parent loop. If the driver needs to get out, please use the parking lot.

Afternoon Pick-up in the Shell Lot at 3:52

- The Shell Lot is another afternoon pickup location. Students will be waiting on the sidewalk under the awning.
- It is essential that parents park, get out of their cars, and come get their children from the sidewalk. This is because we cannot be responsible for supervising children crossing active traffic.
- After 4:05, elementary students will be brought from the Shell Lot to the office.

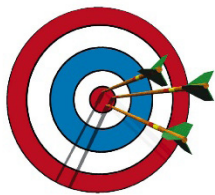

A.I.M. RESOURCE IN FULL SWING –

What a wonderful opportunity our students have this year! The AIM Resource Center – AIM stands for “Academic Intervention and Mentoring” – is fully operational in Room #106, Building 1, designed and supported by one of our long-standing PV math teachers, Ms. Eida Padgett. The Resource Center is an excellent support system for students and their teachers and the reviews offered up by parents and students alike is very positive. Here are a few of the service offerings:

i-Ready Club: Students from both the elementary and middle school level are participating in i-Ready. Utilizing both diagnostic data and teacher recommendation, Ms. Padgett adjusts student lessons so that they are focused on specific mathematical domains; areas of needed support. According to Ms. Padgett, “The iReady Club gives students an opportunity to work on their math skills in a ‘student-oriented’ environment ~ with a teacher available to provide additional assistance, if needed. I see up to 20-25 students per day for iReady club”. iReady Club is offered daily during Period 2 (8:30 a.m. – 9:00 a.m.) or during student lunch hours (Periods 5, 6 and 7). Recommended time spent in lesson is 20 – 30 minutes. iReady Club is by referral only.

Lunch Bunch: Have a math question? Need some help understanding a math concept? Maybe just a little extra practice? Ms. Padgett also offers “Lunch Bunch” sessions. These sessions are open to all students who wish to participate and are centered around the students themselves. These 30-minute sessions include answering individual student questions, reviewing or assisting with homework or even reteaching/reviewing a lesson. Feel free to stop by! Lunch Bunch is open to all students. The current “Lunch Bunch” schedule is as follows:

<u>Grade 3 math</u> -	Wednesdays @ 11:15 a.m.
<u>Grade 4 math</u> -	Thursdays @ 12:30 p.m.
<u>Grade 5 math</u> -	Wednesdays @ 12:30 p.m.
<u>Grade 6 math</u> -	Tuesdays @ 11:30 a.m.
<u>Pre-Algebra</u> -	Wednesdays and Fridays @ 1:30 p.m.

Other Resources: Students are also invited to come at their convenience during the day if they would like any kind of assistance with math. Ms. Padgett is available to work one-on-one with students to help them better understand a problem, a concept or an entire chapter! Small groups of students are welcome to come in, work together at Collaboration Corner; completing homework, project work, even reviewing for an upcoming quiz or test. As one student told Ms. Padgett.... “Sometimes it’s nice to work independently, but reassuring to know that there is a teacher there to help us if we need it – just in case!”

Math Magic Club: On the lighter side, Ms. Padgett is also sponsoring the Math Magic Club. Students in grades 5 and 6 are welcome to join in the fun! Math Magic Club is on Mondays at 11:30 for students in Grade 6 and 12:30 pm for students in Grade 5. During Club time, Ms. Padgett shares the “magic” behind the math. Participants have fun learning through demonstration the power of math and importance of numbers. Ms. Padgett teaches tricks that use each of the basic operations (+, -, x, ÷), as well as techniques that can be used to increase performance in math class – even math competition! Best of all, Math Magic Club teaches listening skills and teamwork; builds confidence, self-esteem and improves mental concentration. Students take their work home to share and amaze family and friends alike.

If your student hasn’t had an opportunity to visit the A.I.M. Math Resource Center, be sure to encourage them to stop by, say hello and check it out. 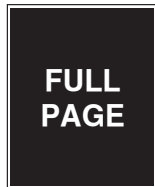

Just a Reminder, all volunteers need to register this year in the new system! They will be NEW VOLUNTEERS. The Community Involvement office will add level 2 data to volunteer profiles. Volunteers can add other schools once they log into their profile from the top dashboard icon. It is quick and easy to add another school.

Instructions for registering as a volunteer in the Community Involvement Portal:

6. If you are a SCS Staff Member or Student, this is when you are finished. If not...
7. After you submit your application, you will receive an e-mail within one to two business days from "Sarasota County Schools <TheAdvocates@VerifiedVolunteers.com>" to complete a background screening. Click the link provided in the e-mail that starts with <https://app.verifiedvolunteers.com/verify> followed by a bunch of letters and/or numbers.
8. Complete the background screening using the information you provided in your application. Most of this information will auto-fill so you will only need to retype a few sections.
 - *Please note: This background screening will request your social security number. This is a secure server that is only associated with Sarasota County Schools. If you do not have a social security number or do not wish to provide it, this could extend the time it will take for approval due to a potential result in false background check findings (i.e., someone with the same name and birthday).*
9. You will receive a confirmation e-mail from "TheAdvocates <TheAdvocates@VerifiedVolunteers.com>" once Sarasota County Schools has reviewed your background screening.

Community Involvement – Volunteers Count!

Level 1 Volunteering

Level 1 is the starting point for all volunteering. You must be Level 1 approved before you can be Level 2 approved. With a Level 1 clearance, you must stay within eye and earshot of a school faculty member or teacher at all times.

To become a Level 1 volunteer, you should:

1. **Sign up!** Sign up on the district's volunteer portal called [Volunteers Count!](#) You can do this from home, at any Sarasota County school, or at the Office of Community Involvement (OCI) the Landings. OCI will notify you when you are approved.
2. **Reach out!** Once approved, you will be added to the schools approved volunteer list. If you are eager, reach out to schools so you can get started ASAP!
3. **Find the best fit!** If you aren't sure where you want to volunteer or what you want to do, contact the school district's Office of Community Involvement to find a school that needs your specific skill set. You can call (941) 927-9000 ext. 31500 or e-mail CommunityInvolvement@sarasotacountyschools.net.
4. **Possibly get Level 2!** Once you are level one approved, you may proceed to get your Level 2 clearance completed. Please Click "Level 2 Volunteering" to learn more.

Level 2 Volunteering

Level 2 is the highest volunteer clearance. This clearance permits you to be alone with students for volunteering purposes. This is also a common clearance needed to chaperone field trips and mentor. To get a Level 2 clearance, you must be fingerprinted by the district's Safety and Security Department.

To become a Level 2 volunteer, you should...

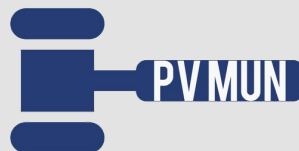
1. **Get Level 1!** You must first be a Level 1 volunteer before you become a Level 2 volunteer. You can become a Level 1 volunteer by applying on our volunteer portal, [Volunteers Count!](#)
2. **Be fingerprinted!** You can be fingerprinted at the District Safety and Security Department at the Landings or the North Port Police Department. The Office of Community Involvement will notify you once you are approved.

How Does Exercise Impact Learning?

Everyone knows exercise is good for your body. However, did you know that exercise immediately benefits your brain as well?

Exercise produces numerous chemicals that affect cognition, mood, and executive function. A chemical that dramatically increases post-exercise is BDNF.

BDNF – Brain-Derived Neurotrophic Factor – is like “miracle grow” for your brain.

BDNF causes growth in connections of brain cells (learning), growth of capacity of systems (attention, memory), and is even involved in growing new brain cells (previously not thought possible!).

BDNF is an anti-depressant, anti-toxic stress factor and correlates with intelligence and memory. Dr. John Ratey, a psychiatrist from Harvard, says that if exercise was a medication, we would all want to buy it – the effects are so beneficial and so powerful.

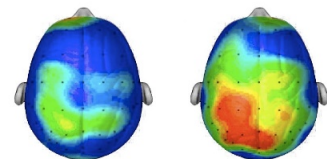

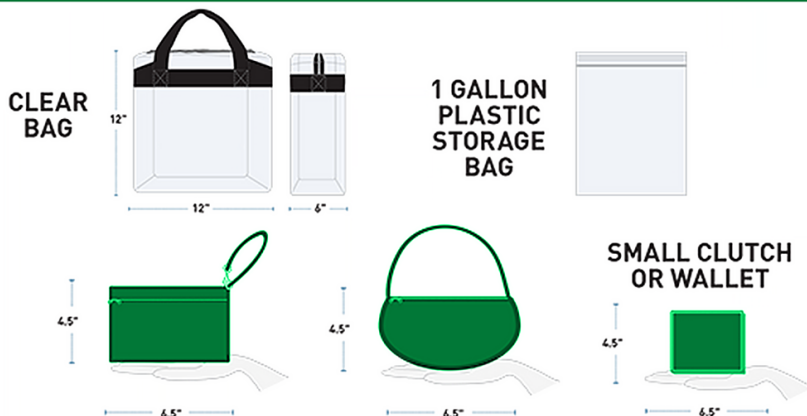

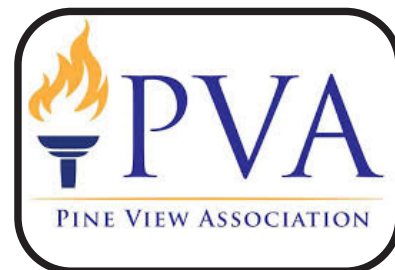
